A **simile** is a comparison of two different things. Usually, the word *like* or *as* is used to show the comparison. Writers use similies as a clever way to describe something and to make their writing more interesting and entertaining. Using similes adds color to a sentence and gives the reader a visual image of the comparison.

For example, the sentence Alyssa's lips are as red as a rose tells the reader just how red Alyssa's lips are. Comparing Alyssa's lips to a rose helps to create that image in the reader's mind.

The Meaning of Metaphors

A **metaphor** is another type of a comparison, but it is less obvious than a simile. Metaphors do not use the words *like* or *as*. Thus, the comparison is not as direct. Read the example below.

Kevin followed in his father's footsteps.

Kevin did not actually follow his father around and step where his father had just stepped. The metaphor means that Kevin followed a path in life similar to that of his father.
